SHOW RULES & REGULATIONS

MEMBERSHIP & REGISTRATION

- ALL RIDERS must hold a valid 2024 membership with NBCRA, VRHA, or Scotia Sliders, and a current valid membership to your Provincial Sport Organization (PROOF WILL BE REQUIRED). An NRHA membership is not required for exhibitors and owners, nor an NRHA competition licence for horses.
- Entry forms will be available online and all exhibitors are encouraged to complete their entries ahead of time. Deadline for entries is **JUNE 14th**.
- The show office will be open at designated hours throughout the weekend to allow all competitors to confirm entries, sign waivers, and pay entry fees. Office hours will be posted on site and on NBCRA's social media outlets the week of the show.

FEES & PAYMENT

 Payment of entry fees via e-transfer is strongly encouraged in advance when entering. Accepted payment methods are e-transfers to <u>codiacreiners@gmail.com</u>, cheques made out to NBCRA, and cash. Entry forms sent in after June 14th will be subject to a \$25.00 late fee - no exceptions.

- For insurance purposes, showing off your trailer will not be permitted. All horses attending the show must have a stall booked.
- Shavings ordered in advance on entry forms are paid to NBCRA. If purchased on site, they are to be paid for directly to PLP.

STABLING, TRAILER HOOKUPS, & PAID WARM UPS

- Stalls, hookups, and paid warm ups must be pre-booked and paid in advance with Julianna Jones. Please let us know in advance who is in your show group so we can make our best efforts to accommodate barns stabling together.
- Stall deposits will not be refunded with the exception of illness or injury to the horse or exhibitor.
- Paid warm ups will take place on Friday evening from 6:00pm to 8:00pm, \$20.00 per 5 minute slot, first come first serve. Schedule will be posted on site and on NBCRA's social media outlets in advance.
- Please be ON TIME for your paid warm up no refunds will be provided for cancelled or missed paid times.
- Stalls and hookups will be first come, first serve and labelled for your arrival.
- Exhibitors hauling in early arrive anytime after 5:00pm on Thursday.

PHOTOGRAPHY & MEDIA

• Official show coverage will be provided by Emily Totton of The Farmer's Wife Photography. No other professional photographers will be permitted to shoot in the ring without WRITTEN permission from show management.

CLASS INFORMATION & ELIGIBILITY

RANCH RIDING

A ranch riding horse is judged on its ability to work at a forward, working speed while performing required maneuvers. The ranch riding horse should simulate a horse riding outside the confines of an arena and reflect the versatility, attitude, and movement of a working horse. Horses show on the provided pattern individually. Judges are looking for relaxed, responsive horses with soft and cadenced gaits. The horse should make timely transitions in a smooth and correct manner, plus the horse should be soft in the bridle and yield to contact.

- **Open** Any horse/rider combination. Horses must be shown one handed in any legal shank bit.
- Non Pro Any horse/rider combination with the exception of professional equine coaches or trainers. Horses must be shown one handed in any legal shank bit.
- Youth Any horse/rider combination. Horses may be shown one or two handed in any legal bit. Riders may not switch between one and two hands partway through the pattern.
- **Green** Any horse/rider combination. Horse/rider combination may not cross enter into any other Ranch Riding class. Horses may be shown one or two handed in any legal bit. Riders may not switch between one and two hands partway through the pattern.

RANCH TRAIL

This class, modeled after the Versatility Ranch Horse ranch trail class, tests a horse's ability to negotiate obstacles that may commonly be found on ranches. Maneuvers include riding over obstacles, opening and closing gates, riding across bridges, backing, sidepasses, and dragging objects.

• **Open** - Any horse/rider combination. Senior horses must show one handed in any legal shank bit. Junior horses are permitted to show with two hands in a snaffle or bosal.

RANCH CONFORMATION

The purpose of this class is to preserve the Ranch Horse type by selecting well-mannered individuals in the order of their resemblance to the breed ideal and that are the most positive combination of balance, structural correctness, and movement with the appropriate breed and sex characteristics and adequate muscling. Horses must be presented well-groomed, no hair trimmed from their ears or muzzle. Horses are to be shown in a good working halter: rope, braided, nylon or plain leather. Horses will walk to the judge one at a time. As the horse approaches, the judge will step to the right to enable the horse to trot straight to a cone placed 12-15 metres away. At the cone, the horse will continue trotting, turn to the left, and trot toward the wall or fence of the arena. After trotting the horses will be lined up head to tail for individual

inspection by the judge. Horses should stand square with a natural neck-headset. Exhibitors must present themselves wearing a long sleeve shirt with a collar, jeans, western boots or a similar working boot, and western hat.

• **Open** - Any horse/handler combination. Horses must have entered at least one other Ranch class to be eligible.

REINING

Reining is a judged event designed to show the athletic ability of a ranch type horse within the confines of a show arena. Each pattern includes small slow circles, large fast circles, flying lead changes, rollbacks over the hocks, 360-degree spins done in place, and exciting sliding stops that are the hallmark of the reining horse. "To rein a horse is not only to guide him, but to control his every movement. The best reined horse should be willingly guided or controlled with little or no apparent resistance and be dictated to completely."

- Green Horse
 - \circ $\,$ Open to any horse with less than \$500 earned in reining.
 - \circ $\;$ Horses may be shown one or two handed in any legal bit.
 - Pattern must be completed as written (no modifications)

• Youth 14-18

- Open to any competitor 14 to 18 years old as of January 1st of the current year.
- Riders may use a horse without the ownership restrictions outlined in the NRHA Handbook.
- Horses may be shown one or two handed in any legal bit.

• Youth 13 & Under

- Open to any competitor 13 years old or younger as of January 1st of the current year.
- Riders may use a horse without the ownership restrictions outlined in the NRHA Handbook.
- \circ $\;$ Horses may be shown one or two handed in any legal bit.
- Green As Grass
 - Open to any rider with less than \$100.00 earned in reining.
 - Rider must be eligible for NRHA Non Pro status.

- Pattern will be modified for *two spins* and riders may choose between simple or flying lead changes without penalty.
- Novice Horse
 - Open to any horse/rider combination where the horse has won less than \$25,000 in reining earnings.
 - Horses must be shown one handed in any legal shank bit.
 - Riders competing in the Non Pro class must be eligible for NRHA Non Pro status.
 - All NRHA rules apply.
- Ladies/Men's Reining
 - Open to any horse/rider combination.
 - Horses may be shown one or two handed in any legal bit.
- Short Stirrups
 - Open to any competitor 12 years old or under as of January 1st of this year.
 - Horses may be shown one or two handed in any legal bit.
- Non Pro
 - Riders must be eligible for NRHA Non Professional status.
 - The definition of a non professional as per the NRHA Handbook is a rider who does not receive remuneration for training or showing astride in any equine discipline; or providing instruction on the showing or training of a performance horse.
 - Horses must be shown one handed.
 - Ownership restrictions will not apply as outlined in the NRHA Handbook.
 - All NRHA rules apply.
- Green Rider
 - Open to any rider with less than \$500.00 earned in reining.
 - Rider must be eligible for NRHA Non Pro status.
 - Horses may be shown one or two handed in any legal bit.
 - Pattern must be completed as written (no modifications)
- Open
 - Any horse/rider combination.
 - Horses are to be shown one handed in any legal shank bit.
 - All NRHA rules apply.
